- Contribute to a better understanding of the <u>diversity</u> of the current surveillance and vaccination strategies;
- Identify potential <u>hurdles</u> towards standardisation and implementation;
- Study the <u>feasibility of such a future</u> <u>network</u>, integrating the expertise of different stakeholders.
- Facilitate the <u>establishment of a</u> <u>European network</u> for surveillance and prevention of viral hepatitis A and B within this region;
